HOW TO ENCOURAGE GOOD READING HABITS IN KIDS

Reading is one of the most fundamental skills children need to learn to be successful. Not only do good reading skills benefit students academically, they are also a skill required for lifelong success. Reading develops vocabulary, increases attention span, and promotes stronger analytical thinking.

GETTING YOUR CHILD INTERESTED IN READING

The key to encouraging reading habits in kids is reading with them at home from a young age. By reading together often, your child will learn first hand the joys reading can bring, helping him or her develop a motivation to read. However, every student learns and processes information differently. This means that some children may have a natural love of reading, and some may not. If your child falls into the second category, don't fret. As parents, there are many different strategies you can use to motivate your child to read. First, it's important to figure out why your child doesn't like reading. WHY DOES MY CHILD HATE READING?

Not every child loves to read. Some common reasons children don't like to

read include:

- Your child feels like reading is a chore
- Your child has difficulty reading
- Your child thinks reading is boring Your child hasn't found the right book yet

The good news is that when you know **why** your child doesn't like to read, you can address the issue and begin to make reading more enjoyable. By learning to make reading fun, your child is more likely to develop a love of reading, encouraging better

Roles of P&C

School P&C Associations appoint an executive committee at their Annual General Meeting (AGM) who are responsible for running the various components of the P&C. Generally, an executive committee consists of a president, vice president, secretary and treasurer. Our P&C is responsible for all tuckshop & uniform shop operations.

President

- provides leadership
- chairs all general and executive committee meetings of the association.
- acts as a spokesperson for the association
- reports to Parents and Citizens Association meetings about the activities of the P&C
- ensures adequate and efficient communication exists between the members of the association and the members of the school board

encouraging parents to participate.

Vice President

Steps into the role of the President should they be unavailable and undertakes tasks to reduce the workload of the President.

The Vice President needs to:

- be familiar with the operation of the P&C
- be acquainted with the duties of President

understand meeting rules and procedure

Secretary

- draws up, in consultation with President, the meeting agendas
- keeps full and correct Minutes of the P&C's proceedings
- acts upon decisions as directed by the meeting
- attends to the correspondence of the association
- looks after the association's documents

maintains a register of financial and ex-officio members if applicable.

Treasurer

- responsible for all funds received and expended by the association
- prepares regular reports to P&C meetings
- holds ultimate responsibility for all funds, including all subcommittee accounts.
